Tattoos

The word 'tattoo' comes from the Tahitian word 'tattau' which means to mark. It was first used by the explorer James Cook in the records of his 1769 expedition to the South Pacific.

In ancient Rome, slaves were often exported with the words 'tax paid' or

'stop me I'm a runaway' tattooed on their foreheads. In Japan, tattoos were first used to punish criminals. First offences were recorded with a line across the forehead; a second offence was marked with an arch and a third was marked by another line. Together, these marks form the Japanese character for dog.

In 1862, the Prince of Wales visited Jerusalem and had the Jerusalem Cross tattooed on his arm, starting a huge fashion for tattoos among the British aristocracy.

The most popular tattoos today are Japanese, tribal and Celtic designs. Dolphins, butterflies, roses and a person's name are also favourites. Although it is fashionable to have a tattoo, the majority of people say that they have come to regret having one done.



Being in debt is a nightmare but there is something you can do about it. Stage one is to sit down and add up all your bills to find out exactly how much you owe. Next make a list of all the money that comes in and how much goes out each month. Then do your sums. How much do you have left each month after paying essential expenses? That's the amount you have left to start paying off your debts.

You **must** pay your mortgage or rent or you could lose your home. Council tax is another priority - at worst, you could go to jail for not paying this. Gas and electricity bills must be paid or you could find yourself cut off. The consequences of not paying credit card or store bill are generally less serious, although goods not paid for may have to be repossessed.

Don't look for quick fixes. Using a debt management service may seem an easy solution but don't forget you have to pay for their services and this money would be better spent paying off your debts. Don't even consider borrowing more money from a loan company. You will be paying a massive rate of interest and just exchanging one debt for another.

You can keep your debts down by paying more than the minimum each month off your credit card. See if you can switch your credit card balance to a card that offers a lower interest rate. Try to pay regular bills by direct debit, so that you know exactly how much you're spending each month.

DIWALI

Diwali, the Hindu festival of lights, is a popular festival which comes from South Asia.

The festival extends over five days during the months of October or November and involves lights, fireworks and the giving of sweets. This makes it a great time for children.

Preparations for Diwali may begin three weeks before the event. It is seen as a time to redecorate houses and buy new clothes. Rangoli are drawn on the floors. These are patterns and the most popular subject is the lotus flower.

During Diwali itself, every village home is lit at night with little lamps in the hope that Lakshmi, the goddess of good luck and wealth, will visit it. These lamps are traditionally fuelled with mustard oil, although in big towns electric lights are more commonly used.
