(c) How much is it worth after 5 years?
(d) How many whole years does it take until it is worth less than $£ 1000$ ?

The diagram shows a circle, centre C , that just fits inside a right-angled, isosceles triangle, PQR . The circle touches the triangle at $\mathrm{L}, \mathrm{M}$ and N . The length $\mathrm{RQ}=2 \mathrm{~cm}$.
(a) Write down the length MQ.
(b) Write down the length LQ
(c) Use Pythagoras's Theorem to show that $\mathrm{PQ}=\sqrt{2} \mathrm{~cm}$
(d) Write down the radius of the circle
(e) Show that the ratio

3. Solve the following equations for $x$ and $y$
(a) $2^{x} \times 2^{5}=2^{9}$
(b) $\frac{2^{4}}{2^{x}}=2^{-6}$
(c) $2^{x+1} \times 2^{3 x-4}=2^{7-x}$
(d) $2^{x} \times 2^{y}=2^{9}$
$2^{3 x} \times 2^{-y}=2^{7}$
(Note: in part (d) there are two equations to be solved simultaneously, so you need to give a value for $x$ and a value for $y$ ).

(a) If the perimeter of the rectangle is 50 cm , find $x$
(b) If the area of the rectangle is $198 \mathrm{~cm}^{2}$, find $x$
(c) If the length $\mathrm{AC}=10 \mathrm{~cm}$, write down an equation and show that

(5 x+19)(x-5)=0 \text { and fomon find } x .
