TASK DB1

This database currently consists of five tables called CUSTOMER, HOUSE, JOB, SERVICE and STAFF.

A new database table is required to hold information about payscales.

- Create a new table called PAYSCALE, that includes the following fields:
 - PayPerHour field with a data type of Currency;
 - PayScaleLevel field with a data type of number and field size of byte.
- Select an appropriate primary key.
- Produce a screenshot of the design of the PAYSCALE table showing clearly the field name and data type for each of the fields within the table.
- Save the screenshot as NEWTABLE.
- Print NEWTABLE.
- Label the printout NEWTABLE.
- Close the PAYSCALE table and save the changes.
