- 3** Read the passage and answer all the questions.

Agesilaos has been commander-in-chief of the Greek forces in Asia, but returns home to lead Sparta to victory over Thebes, behaving chivalrously towards his enemies.

Agesilaos met the Thebans head on; when the armies came together, for a long time they drove against each other with their shields, men fought and killed, and were killed. And there was no shouting, but only the sound of the rage of battle.

The Thracian ordered Timokleia to tell him where she had hidden her possessions. She led him into the garden¹ and showed him a well², saying that she threw them into it when the city was being besieged. As the Thracian looked into the well, she pushed³ him into it and threw stones on to him so that he could not get out. When the other Thracians realised this, they seized her and took her to Alexander. He asked her who she was, and she said that she was the sister of Theagenes who fought against his father and died for Greece. Alexander admired her words and what she did, and ordered her to be set free with her children.
