(b) 'It is his own relentless investigation, and that alone, which destroys Oedipus.' Do you agree? In your answer you should refer both to Passage 2B and to the rest of the play. [25]

(a) Show how Aristophanes makes Passage 3A lively and amusing. [25]

(b) With reference both to Passage 3B and to the rest of the play, what impression do you think Aristophanes gives of philosophers and what they do? [25]
