Option 1: The fall of the Roman Republic 81-31 BC

- 1 ‘It was the growth in the power of individuals at the expense of the state which eventually destroyed the Republic.’ How far would you agree with this view? [50]
- 2 How accurately can we assess the extent to which social and economic problems affected the politics of this period? [50]
- 3 How far does the evidence help us to understand the aims and intentions of politicians during this period? [50]
- 4 ‘Political success depended upon military success.’ To what extent do the sources support this view of the ways in which politicians achieved success? [50]

Option 2: The invention of Imperial Rome 31 BC-AD 96

You are reminded that you must use relevant original sources in your answer, and that marks are awarded for the quality of the written communication in your answer.

- 5 ‘Succession was a major issue for every emperor; no emperor found a successful solution to this problem.’ How far would you agree with this view? [50]
- 6 How accurately can we assess the extent to which emperors succeeded in transforming the social and moral life of Rome during this period? [50]
- 7 ‘Some emperors succeeded in creating good relations with the different groups within the city of Rome; others failed completely.’ How far do the sources support this view of the relations between the emperors and the people of Rome? [50]
- 8 How far would you agree that the building projects of the emperors would have made the Rome of Domitian unrecognisable to Augustus? [50]

Option 3: Ruling the Roman Empire AD 14-117

- 9 How accurately can we assess the extent to which Rome succeeded in romanising the provinces during this period? [50]
- 10 To what extent do the sources give us an adequate account of the policies of the emperors towards the frontiers during this period? [50]
- 11 How far does the evidence help us to understand the effectiveness of the administration of the provinces during this period? [50]
- 12 How helpful are the sources for our understanding of the ways that emperors promoted their image in different parts of the Empire? [50]
