- 2 To what extent do the sources over-emphasise the importance of individuals in the conflict between the Greeks and the Persians? [50]
- 3 ‘The defeats inflicted on Xerxes weakened the Persians so much that all the Greeks were free after 479 BC.’ To what extent do you agree with this view? [50]
- 4 ‘Herodotus gives us a balanced account of the causes of conflict between the Greeks and the Persians.’ To what extent is this a fair assessment? [50]

- 6 ‘The leadership of key individuals transformed Athens and Sparta.’ To what extent do the sources support this view? [50]
- 7 How far do the sources enable us to understand the social and economic effects of conflict within the Greek world? [50]
- 8 ‘Thucydides and Xenophon give us a limited view of the relationships between Greek city-states during this period.’ To what extent is this a fair assessment? [50]

- 11 To what extent do the sources enable us to understand how the Sophists affected the intellectual climate in Athens? [50]
- 12 'The dramatic festivals in Athens were primarily concerned with religion.' To what extent do the sources support this view? [50]
