- 2 Suggest and briefly explain TWO factors which might have influenced some of the views expressed in DOCUMENT 3. In your answer, you should refer to particular contributions to the discussion in Document 3. [6]**

- 3 The contributors to the discussion in DOCUMENT 3 recommend different choices for individuals who know that someone is committing benefit theft. Evaluate the choice recommended by ONE of the following: Bruce, Denise, Ed or Gary. You should use THREE criteria (such as fairness). [12]**

- 4 Write an argument supporting the choice recommended by any ONE of the following: Bruce, Denise, Ed or Gary. In your argument you should use some of the relevant principles and explain why you have rejected at least one of the other views. Support your argument by referring critically to material from the Resource Booklet. [36]**
