



# AS/A Level English Language

(Available for teaching from September 2008)

**This new specification aims to deepen learners' interest and enjoyment in the use of English.** Learners will develop and apply their understanding of the concepts and methods appropriate for the analysis and study of language; undertake some independent investigative work; engage creatively and independently with a varied programme for the study of English from past to present day and develop their skills as producers and interpreters of language.



## What are the benefits to me and my students of delivering this OCR specification?

- A four unit format equally split between external and internal assessment. The fewer examined units reduces the burden of assessment for learners.
- The inclusion of new units on popular and accessible topics such as 'Media Language'.
- Encourages candidates to undertake independent investigative projects.
- Good foundation for a variety of subjects at Higher Education level as well as careers involving creativity in text production.
- There is a refreshed approach to previously popular topics in response to centre feedback.

| Mandatory           | <b>F652: Texts and Audiences</b><br>Learners produce coursework for internal assessment on the themes of audience and purpose; taking into account cultural contexts in which texts are produced.<br><br>The unit provides candidates with the opportunity to undertake a sustained study of their own looking at language use, context and effect across different modes. | Coursework – 3000 words maximum<br>AS Level – 40%<br>A Level – 20% |

| Mandatory           | <b>F653: Culture, Language and Identity</b><br>This unit explores issues surrounding dialect, culture, power and identity and enables a deeper understanding of stylistic variation.   | 2 hour exam<br>A Level – 30%                     |
| Mandatory           | <b>F654: Media Language</b><br>This unit gives learners the opportunity to compare and analyse texts from three different modes – spoken, written and multimodal.<br><br>Learners undertake a sustained study of language analysis and create their own writing. | Coursework – 3000 words maximum<br>A Level – 20% |
