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**Texts 7–8, Mass Media**

- 3 « Les médias ont des effets positifs et négatifs sur la société française. »  
Qu’en pensez-vous?

Vous pourriez considérer, par exemple:

- la télévision
- la radio
- Internet
- la presse
- la publicité.
