THE BRONTË PARSONAGE MUSEUM

The Brontë family lived in Haworth Parsonage for 41 years. It is rare to find even two great writers in one family, but all three Brontë sisters wrote novels.

The museum gives a fascinating look at the life of the girls, forced to work as governesses before turning to writing.

In the 19th century Haworth was an industrial town and life was hard. The average age at death was 25 and nearly half of children did not reach the age of 6.

Visits

There are no guided tours, but visitors are given a leaflet, available in several languages, to provide information on each of the rooms.

The museum provides educational activities for all ages, which can be adapted to suit your group.



The shop sells books and souvenirs. All income helps to maintain the museum and the collections.
