- 2 The volunteer who was interviewed said that he interferes to stop the development of a climax community and to keep a plagio-climax community in the reed beds. With reference to this statement:
 - suggest why he might wish to maintain the wetland plagio-climax community;
 - suggest how he might do this at the East Chevington reed-beds.

- 3 (a) Identify the potential for increased tourism in the area to the east of the A1068. You should make clear reference to the OS map extract in your answer. (10 marks)
