- 10 'The more economically and technologically advanced an area, the greater the human impact on the physical environment.' Discuss. [30]

- 11 How far is it possible to reduce the impacts of climatic hazards? [30]
- 12 To what extent are risks from anticyclones the result of physical factors? [30]

- 16 Assess the degree to which international aid benefits both donors and recipients. [30]

- 18 Evaluate the influence of economic factors on levels of development. [30]

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
