BRONTË PARSONAGE MUSEUM

HAWORTH, WEST YORKSHIRE

The Brontës were an extraordinary literary family. The Reverend Patrick Brontë, his wife and their six children lived at the parsonage in Haworth. The two eldest daughters died in childhood, but the others survived to adulthood.

Charlotte's *Jane Eyre and Emily's *Wuthering Heights** were both published in 1847 and are ranked among the greatest novels in the English language. But the father, daughter Anne and son Branwell all had works published too. The Brontës were a close family and the dramatic landscape of the surrounding moors provided them with inspiration for their writing.**

The parsonage, a museum since 1928, was one of the largest houses in Haworth at the time and their home from 1820 to 1861. Twelve rooms have been restored to their original appearance with furniture, manuscripts and personal items.
