**Topic 3 The Executive Branch of Government**

**0 5** Examine the operation of 'iron triangles' in US policy making. **[10 marks]**

**0 6** 'The power and influence of the Executive Office of the President far exceed those of the cabinet.' Discuss. **[30 marks]**

**Topic 4 The Judicial Branch of Government: The Supreme Court**

**0 7** Explain the distinction between judicial activism and judicial restraint. **[10 marks]**

**0 8** 'Constitutionally separate but not outside the political battle.' Evaluate this description of the role of the US Supreme Court. **[30 marks]**
