Source for Question 1

The Constitution limits the powers of the presidency. Despite a mandate and majorities in both the Senate and the House, President Obama found it difficult to get congressional support for health care reform and for plans to cut greenhouse gases. Part of the problem was the absence of a filibuster-proof supermajority in the Senate for most of the first term. More generally, presidents have encountered problems due to the increased polarisation of parties over the last 20 years, which has prevented a bipartisan approach being adopted.


