Question 1

During a consultation with her GP Angela had her temperature and blood pressure measured. The GP also took Angela's medical history into account before referring Angela for an MRI scan at a local hospital.

- 0 1 Describe how the GP can measure Angela's temperature. (3 marks) 2 Describe how the GP can measure Angela's blood pressure. (3 marks) 3 Briefly explain how the GP would find out Angela's medical history. (3 marks) Briefly explain why it is important that the GP takes Angela's medical history into 4 account. (3 marks) Explain the principles and use of Magnetic Resonance Imaging (MRI). 5 (6 marks)
- O 6 Give one advantage and one disadvantage of an MRI scan compared to ultrasound scanning. (2 marks)

Question 2

A study of reported infectious diseases in a population over four years (2004–2007) produced the data shown in the table below.

(3 marks) A survey of patients was carried out to find their views on the quality of treatment and care they received from the staff of a health centre. A structured interview was used for the survey. 0 9 Give **two** advantages of using a structured interview, compared with an unstructured interview, to gain the patients' views. (2 marks) 0 Suggest two different reasons why an unstructured interview may have been better than a structured interview to gain the patients' views. (2 marks) 1 A medical drug which is administered by injection is known by three different types of name. What are the **three** types of drug name? (3 marks) 2 Give **one** reason for administering the medical drug by injection. (1 mark) Question 3 George needs a liver transplant operation. This operation will require a general anaesthetic and some microsurgery. Briefly explain what is meant by a general anaesthetic and why this is necessary for 1 3 George's surgery. (4 marks) 4 Briefly explain what is meant by microsurgery. (4 marks) 5 Describe the broad principles of transplant surgery with reference to George's operation. (4 marks) Explain the principles of home nursing and state how they differ from the principles of 1 6 hospital nursing. The quality of written communication will be assessed in this question. - 1 8 Give **three** side effects Leanne is likely to have as a result of her radiotherapy treatment. (3 marks)
- 1 9 Discuss the ethical issues associated with the treatment of diseases and dysfunctions directly related to smoking tobacco.
