1. Wales and England, c.1815-1832.

- (a) Explain why there was a demand for parliamentary reform between 1815 and 1832. [24]
- (b) To what extent was government action the main cause of popular protest in the period 1815-1832? [36]

2. British foreign policy, c.1815-1865.

- (a) Explain why the Eastern Question was important in Palmerston's foreign policy. [24]
- (b) To what extent was British foreign policy consistent between 1815-1865? [36]

3. Society in transition, 1815-1846.

- (a) Explain why Sir Robert Peel issued the Tamworth Manifesto in 1834. [24]
- (b) To what extent were Royal Commission enquiries into working and living conditions mainly responsible for changes in society in the period 1815-1846? [36]
