**1. Wales and England, c.1815-1832.**

- (a) Explain why there was disappointment with the terms of the 1832 Reform Act. [24]
- (b) To what extent was government action mainly the result of fear of revolution in England and Wales 1815-1832? [36]

**2. British foreign policy, c.1815-1865.**

- (a) Explain why the Eastern Question was important to Britain in this period. [24]
- (b) To what extent was British foreign policy between 1815 and 1865 dominated by sympathy for liberal movements in Europe? [36]

**3. Society in transition, 1815-1846.**

- (a) Explain why governments reformed conditions in factories and mines in the 1830s and 1840s. [24]
- (b) To what extent was the repeal of the Corn Laws the most significant change in social and economic conditions in Wales and England between 1815 and 1846? [36]
