SECTION A

Answer one question.

1. England's relations with Ireland, Scotland and Wales, c. 1603-1649

2. James II, the Glorious Revolution and party politics c. 1685-1715

'By 1715, the Glorious Revolution had done more to harm the power of Parliament than the power of the Crown.' Discuss. [40]

Answer one question.

1. Crime, disorder and protest, c. 1603-1715

To what extent were social problems mainly responsible for the growth in protest and disorder in the period between 1603 and 1715? [40]

2. England's changing relations with foreign powers, c. 1603-1715

To what extent were relations with France the most important influence on England's foreign policy in the period between 1603 and 1715? [40]
