In your answer to part (a) you are advised to provide a linked and coherent explanation.

In your answer to part (b) you are advised to evaluate the issue named in the question against a range of other important issues.

1. Wales and England in transition, c. 1880-1929

- (a) **Explain why** the Liberal Governments of 1906-1914 introduced social reforms. [24]
- (b) To what extent were the effects of war the **most important influence** on the lives of the people of Wales and England 1880-1929? [36]

2. British foreign policy, c. 1902-1939

- (a) **Explain why** Britain signed an Entente with France in 1904. [24]
- (b) To what extent was Britain's relationship with Germany the **most important influence** on British foreign policy between 1902 and 1939? [36]

3. Party politics, c. 1900-1940

- (a) **Explain why** the Coalition Government of Lloyd George came to an end in 1922. [24]
- (b) To what extent was the formation of the first Labour Government in 1924 the **most important development** in party politics 1900-1940? [36]

4. The changing role and status of women, 1880-1929

- (a) **Explain why** the Suffragette movement became more militant. [24]
- (b) To what extent was government legislation **mainly responsible** for the changing role and status of women 1880-1929? [36]
