## GCE Advanced Level and GCE Advanced Subsidiary Level

Grade thresholds taken for Syllabus 9084 (Law) in the October/November 2007 examination.

|             | maximum mark available | minimum mark required for grade: |    |    |

| Component 1 | 75                     | 46                               | 40 | 19 |
| Component 2 | 50                     | 37                               | 33 | 18 |
| Component 3 | 75                     | 38                               | 32 | 17 |
| Component 4 | 75                     | 43                               | 38 | 23 |

The thresholds (minimum marks) for Grades C and D are normally set by dividing the mark range between the B and the E thresholds into three. For example, if the difference between the B and the E threshold is 24 marks, the C threshold is set 8 marks below the B threshold and the D threshold is set another 8 marks down. If dividing the interval by three results in a fraction of a mark, then the threshold is normally rounded down.

Grade Thresholds are published for all GCE A/AS and IGCSE subjects where a corresponding mark scheme is available.
