





3 Consider whether or not the following claimants will be likely to succeed in an action for private nuisance:

- (a) Alice recently bought a house opposite a sweet factory. The factory has been there for 100 years and employs lots of people. Alice viewed the house on a Saturday when the factory was closed. Having moved in Alice has realised that during the week there is a strong smell of liquorice. Many local people find this pleasant but Alice really dislikes the smell. (10)
- (b) Bob owns a cottage next to a wildlife reserve which attracts lots of birds. This summer a large flock of geese arrive and staff at the reserve feed them to encourage them to return in the future. So many geese mean that a lot of bird droppings fall onto Bob's garden, ruining his prize-winning, rare African water-lilies. (10)
- (c) Charley is 17-years-old and lives at home with her parents. She belongs to lots of social networking websites and uses her smartphone to keep in touch with her friends. The local council has recently built a large office block which has blocked the smartphone signal to Charley's house and she can no longer communicate with her friends. (10)
