- 1 Barnston FC is a football club whose home games usually attract a crowd of about 15,000. At recent matches, there has been a rise in violent behaviour by fans both in the stadium and in the local town. The club is most concerned with reducing this problem within the stadium itself.

- (a) Describe and explain **two** measures that Barnston FC could put in place to improve the safety and security of spectators in the stadium at future matches.

An assessment of the club's recent safety record found the following problems, all of which could have been avoided with correct implementation of the Health and Safety at Work Act 1974 (HASAWA):

- Recently the fire alarm was set off accidentally. Staff were not sure where to meet up and three fire doors were found to be blocked by training equipment.
- Two turnstiles jammed at the previous home match. This meant that too many people tried to get through the others and some people were injured in the crush. The turnstiles had not been repaired for the next match so customers had to queue for longer than usual.
- HSE inspectors found that some long-serving staff were putting customers at risk because they were unaware that some of the key requirements of the Act changed in 1999.
- An assistant groundsman suffered burns when painting lines on the pitch. He did not realise he had to wear gloves to handle the equipment used for this.

*(d) Analyse the benefits to Barnston FC of correctly implementing the requirements of HASAWA. In your answer you should refer to the problems above.

- 2** The management team at Barnston FC are worried about a decrease in productivity. This is as a result of staff working inefficiently and a lack of coordination between different departments. Staff were asked to comment on their work and a typical selection of comments were:

- 'although I see my supervisor daily we don't get much of a chance to talk about the job'
- 'at times I'm not quite sure what I'm meant to be doing and I don't really know who to ask for advice'
- 'I would like to progress here but I'm not sure what else I could do or how I could develop my skills'
- 'unless I make a serious mistake it's unusual for me to be told how I'm doing'.

The management team have decided to introduce the Investors in People quality system.

- *(a) Analyse the possible benefits to Barnston FC of introducing the Investors in People quality system. In your answer you should refer to the comments above.

Many of their staff have been working there a long time and the recent recession has left the club struggling financially. Staff motivation is at a low level.

Barnston FC's season tickets went on sale in May. In order to boost sales, supporters are offered a choice of ways to pay. They can pay by a single payment or by direct debit over a number of months. The costs for a ticket for the main stand are as follows:

- a single payment by debit card or credit card of £400. Payment by credit card will be subject to an additional charge of 2%
 - ten monthly payments by direct debit of £45.

Barnston FC's pitch is poorly drained and four home matches had to be postponed last season. The management team are considering replacing it with an artificial pitch, but some of them are worried. They do not know whether they can afford it or whether it would be ready for the start of next season. The club secretary thinks it is a good idea as it should prevent any future postponements. A local hockey club, which is looking for somewhere to train, has shown interest in hiring it. Unlike a grass pitch, extra use will not damage the artificial pitch.
