Theme: Knowledge of the external world

- 1 (a) Explain and illustrate **one** argument for distinguishing between primary and secondary qualities. (15 marks)
 - (b) Consider whether the strengths of idealism outweigh the weaknesses. (30 marks)

Theme: Tolerance

- 2 (a) Describe and illustrate **two** characteristics a tolerant individual should possess. (15 marks)
 - (b) 'Religious believers should tolerate lifestyles which they find disagreeable.'
 Discuss arguments in favour of this view. (30 marks)

Theme: The value of art

- 3 (a) Explain and illustrate the notion of 'form' in relation to works of art. (15 marks)
 - (b) 'We value art because it expresses the artist's feelings.' Consider what can be said both for **and** against this view. (30 marks)

Theme: God and the world

- **4** (a) Describe **one** feature of the World that appears to show design. Explain **one** reason for doubting this feature does show design. (15 marks)
 - (b) 'Natural evil does not count against the existence of God.' Discuss. (30 marks)

Theme: Free will and determinism

- 5 (a) Explain and illustrate the distinction between reasons and causes. (15 marks)
 - (b) Explore the claim that because human beings have minds as well as bodies, they have free will. (30 marks)
