# Mark Scheme for November 2001 Question Paper 8698/1

## Paper 1, The Core Studies I

#### Section A

## Candidates must answer all questions

#### Question

- 1 Most likely answers: the different verbs affect the estimate of speed, the verbs create a demand characteristic in the response, there is very little difference between the top three verbs: 2 marks each
- 2 (a) Most likely answers: 2D /3D perception of pictures, depth perception: 1-2 marks.
  - (b) Most likely answers; communication problems, expression problems: 1-2 marks according to appropriateness of response.
- 3 (a) Our ability to understand what is probably in the mind of another person: 2 marks
  - (b) Most likely answers; make incorrect responses to the belief question in the Sally-Anne test, problems with social functioning: 2 marks.
- 4 Most likely answers: university setting, social politeness, presence of experimenter, demand characteristics, : 1 mark each
- Most likely answers: ethnocentrism, social cohesion, fear of people outside own group, difficulty in interpreting out-group behaviour:

  1-2 marks each as appropriate according to accuracy of response.
- 6 (a) Favouring the in-group, dissing the out-group and devaluing what they do or create: 2 marks
  - (b) Most likely answer; categorisation: 2 marks.
- 7 (a) Outline of conservation task: 1-2 marks.
  - (b) Most likely answers; age, practice, type of question; 1 mark each
- 8 (a) Most likely answers; children imitate people like themselves, not real life. 2 marks
  - (b) Most likely answers; imitation of violent acts and aggressive language; 2 marks
- 9 Most likely answers: the long term effects of early life experiences, the different way they are treated as teenagers by their respective carers; 2 marks each
- 10 (a) Non-active experimental condition: 2 marks. Brief description, for example'sugar pill' 1 mark.

- (b) Minimal response to the environment because the arousal component was not present: 2 marks.
- 11 (a) Pencil: 1 mark, appropiate reason: 1 further mark
  - (b) Hamster: 1 mark, appropiate reason: 1 further mark
- Most likely answers; difficult to identify hot spots, colour enhancement, individual differences in brain structure, is a hot spot an off or on switch: 1-2 marks for each problem.
- 13 (a) Most likely answer; average mental age was 13 giving an IQ score of under 70: 1-2 marks as appropriate according to accuracy of response.
  - (b) Most likely answer; problems with test administration, problems with test validity: 1-2 marks as appropriate according to accuracy of response.
- Most likely answers: greater enfranchisement of Black people, civil rights campaigns, role models, visibility in published material:
  - 1-2 marks each as appropriate according to accuracy of response.
- Most likely answers: meal time behaviour, contact with patients by the staff, medication behaviour, daily ward routine.
  - 1-2 marks each as appropriate according to accuracy of response.
