**Question 1 How the synoptic gospels came into being**

**0 | 1** Examine reasons for translating the original Greek synoptic gospels texts into other languages. (30 marks)

and

**0 | 2** 'A translation can never be the Word of God.'  
Assess this claim. (15 marks)

**Question 2 Aspects of Jesus' teaching and action, parables and healings**

**0 | 3** Examine the teaching found in the Parable of the Sower. (30 marks)

and

**0 | 4** 'Without the help of scholars, the parables cannot be understood.'  
Assess this claim. (15 marks)

**Question 3 The arrest, trial and death of Jesus**

**0 | 5** Examine the main differences between the accounts of Jesus' arrest and trial in Mark and Luke. (30 marks)

and

**0 | 6** 'Jesus could have avoided his crucifixion.'  
Assess this claim. (15 marks)

**Question 4 The resurrection of Jesus**

**0 | 7** Explain how the accounts in Matthew and Luke of Jesus' resurrection and later appearances support the view that these events were historical. (30 marks)

and

**0 | 8** 'The resurrection narratives have little importance for Christian faith.'  
Assess this claim. (15 marks)
