- 1 (a) With particular reference to The Didache, Hippolytus and Cyprian, explain the doctrine and practice of Baptism as it developed in the first three centuries.

- (b) Critically assess the view that the sacraments are no longer important in the life of the Church.
[20 marks]

- 2 (a) Discuss the main characteristics of Gnosticism and give reasons why the Church condemned it as a heresy.
[30 marks]

- (b) Critically evaluate the view that the existence of heresy had positive benefits for the Early Church. [20 marks]

3 (a) Outline and consider the contribution made by Tertullian to the development of doctrine and practice in the Early Church. [30 marks]

(b) “Tertullian’s writings are irrelevant for the Church today.”

Critically assess this view. [20 marks]

4 (a) Discuss the main teachings of Arius and consider why they were seen as so threatening to the Church at that time. [30 marks]

(b) Critically evaluate the view that the Council of Nicaea was not totally successful. [20 marks]
