- 1 (a) Explain the similarities between the covenants G-d made with Adam and with Noah. [25]
- (b) 'The stories of the covenants with Adam and with Noah lose all significance unless they are historically true.' Discuss. [10]
- 2 (a) Explain the main features of the covenant G-d made with David in 2 Samuel 7. [25]
- (b) 'The promise of land was the least important feature of the covenant with David.' Discuss. [10]
- 3 (a) Explain the difficulties of the situations faced by Jonah and Job. [25]
- (b) To what extent do the books of Jonah and of Job suggest that G-d is to blame for human suffering? [10]
- 4 (a) Explain why the prophet Elijah went to Mount Horeb and the significance of what happened there. [25]
- (b) To what extent did the experience on Mount Horeb change Elijah's understanding of the role of a prophet? [10]
