1.

There are points of agreement between the theodicies of Augustine and Irenaeus. Both agree that God permits evil. Both think that God is just and loving. However, whereas Augustine stresses God's justice, Irenaeus stresses God's love.

- (a) Summarise the main points of the theodicies of Augustine and Irenaeus. [10]
- (b) Explain the main weaknesses of these theodicies. [10]

2. (a) Explain the argument for God's existence based on apparent design in the universe. [10]
- (b) 'The argument based on design is a strong one.'
Assess this view. [10]

3. (a) Explain why it is difficult to prove that God exists. [10]
- (b) Assess how far arguments for God's existence that you have studied reduce these difficulties. [10]
