The story of Jesus' birth is told by only two of the four gospel writers (Matthew and Luke), and the two accounts differ. They both agree, however, that his birth involved supernatural elements, and that this was no ordinary child.

- (a) Explain in what ways the *two* gospel *accounts* of Jesus' birth *differ*. [10]
(b) Examine the *supernatural* elements that were involved in Jesus' birth. [10]

2. (a) Describe, with examples, the characteristics of apocalyptic literature in the New Testament. [10]
(b) 'New Testament apocalyptic literature has no meaning for people today.' Assess this view. [10]

3. (a) Examine the main differences between the gospel accounts of the resurrection of Jesus. [10]
(b) 'A Christian does not have to believe in the resurrection of Jesus.' Assess this statement. [10]
