According to the gospel writers, Jesus often taught in parables. The meaning of these parables is not always clear. Nevertheless, to those who strive to understand them they illustrate some features of the kingdom of God, or some other truth.

- (a) Explain the purposes of parables in the New Testament. [10]
- (b) Examine the meaning of any **two** of Jesus' parables. [10]
2. (a) Explain how different gospel writers seek to show that Jesus was the incarnation of God. [10]
- (b) 'The gospel writers make it more difficult to believe in Jesus with their claim that he was divine.'
Assess this statement. [10]
3. (a) Outline the events which must happen before the second coming of Christ, according to the passages of the New Testament you have studied. [10]
- (b) 'There will be no second coming of Christ.'
Assess this view. [10]
