 - (b) **‘Television is the only effective way to teach about religion.’
Assess this view. [15]**

3. (a) Examine what is meant by the term 'secularisation'. [30]
- (b) 'Religious beliefs, not religious practices, are flourishing in contemporary Britain.' Assess this view. [15]
4. (a) Examine Freud's view of religious belief. [30]
- (b) 'Religious belief is essential for psychological health.' Assess this view. [15]
