

The remains of the largest domestic Roman building yet found in Britain, with many mosaic floors, were opened to the public in 1968.

- Museum with a large range of Roman objects
- New Audio-Visual computer-generated images describe the palace as it was 2000 years ago.
- Outside are the Roman Garden Museum and the Formal Garden, replanted to the original plan.
- Guided tours at weekends and during school holidays.
- Group visits by arrangement.
- Gift shop

You should start the task as indicated, but the way in which the task develops will, of course, vary from candidate to candidate. You should not feel constrained to follow the order shown below if this is not appropriate. The items printed in bold which relate to the completion of the task must be explored for each candidate. Where there are other suggestions in brackets these may help to develop the main points.

Situation

As on the candidate's sheet. You are a Spaniard visiting Great Britain with your family and want to visit a place of interest with your family.

The Task

You begin the task as follows:

“Soy un español / una española que visita Gran Bretaña. Quiero visitar un lugar de interés y necesito tu ayuda. Pero, primero creo que tienes unas preguntas que quieres hacerme, ¿no.”

In response to the candidate's questions you answer:

- 1 You are a family with two children, a grandparent of 67 and a small dog.
- 2 You are all interested in old buildings and one of you particularly likes gardens.

During the discussion you comment and ask questions to find out the following information:

- **Where is the Roman Palace?**
- **What are the main features of the attraction?**
- **What facilities are offered?**
- **When is the palace open and what tickets are available?**
- **How can you find out any other information?**

During the conversation you will also discuss

- **What would be an ideal excursion for the candidate?**
- **Does the candidate think there's any value in studying history?**

The Task

You begin the task as follows:

- 1 You do not have a car so will use public transport of all kinds.
- 2 You will be living and working in the area for a few months.

During the discussion you comment and ask questions to find out the following information:

- **What is the card?**
- **Can you only use it on buses?**
- **How does it work?**
- **Is it hard to get one or to top up the credit?**
- **How can you find out any other information?**

During the conversation you will also discuss

- **Does the candidate think public transport is a good or bad idea?**
- **Is it better to live in a big city or in a small town or village?**
