Completing Section B

Unit 1 -This unit rewards students for their ability to converse in French on a general topic area that they have chosen in advance. They must choose one of the following general topic areas: **Youth culture and concerns; Lifestyle: health and fitness; The world around us** or **Education and employment**.

Unit 3 - This unit requires students to demonstrate the effectiveness of their language skills by presenting and taking a **clear stance on any issue of their choice**. Students will first need to outline their chosen issue for about one minutes, adopting a definite stance towards the issue. They should then defend and justify their opinions for up to four minutes
