Language use will show competence and accuracy although range may be limited, especially in terms of technical vocabulary.	Candidates demonstrate good evidence of application of critical reading techniques. Some evidence of the detailed analysis of text covering such aspects as visuals, text, tone, layout, audience appeal, conventions, narrative, genre, representation and mode of address. Responses explore the text in an active way, selecting significant details to inform their responses.	4 (13-16 marks)

3 (5–6 marks)	Competent awareness and understanding of the categories, forms and uses of communication as applied to contemporary life. Language will be clear despite inaccuracies and limitations and/or some evidence of a technical vocabulary or register will be offered.	Candidates demonstrate satisfactory evidence of application of critical reading techniques. Competent response which operates at a fairly basic level but offers an informed commentary on the text. Response will likely concentrate on versions of a 'preferred reading'.	3 (9–12 marks)
2 (3–4 marks)	Candidates communicate limited awareness and understanding of the categories, forms and uses of communication as applied to contemporary life. Limited in terms of its linguistic competence and/or its command of the language of the subject.	Candidates demonstrate limited evidence of application of critical reading techniques. Mostly descriptive – comments on surface features of text only. Some limited awareness of the techniques of textual analysis will be evident, but insufficient to clearly meet the demands of AS level.	2 (5–8 marks)
1 (1–2 marks)	Candidates communicate little awareness and understanding of the categories, forms and uses of communication as applied to contemporary life. Confused to the point where communication is impeded.	Candidates demonstrate little or no evidence of application of critical reading techniques. Little appropriate material offered. An engaged and confident comparison of the texts, demonstrating a clear grasp of the techniques of critical reading. Concepts will be handled with skill and applied relevantly.	5 (17–20 marks)
4 (7–8 marks)	Candidates communicate good awareness and understanding of the categories, forms and uses of communication as applied to contemporary life. Language use will show competence and accuracy although range may be limited, especially in terms of technical vocabulary.	Candidates demonstrate good evidence of application of critical reading techniques. Some evidence of analysis of the texts and a recognition of potential differences, such as context, purpose and the nature of the representations. The relationship between texts and their intended readers will likely be explored.	4 (13–16 marks)
3 (5-6 marks)	Candidates communicate competent awareness and understanding of the categories, forms and uses of communication as applied to contemporary life. Language will be clear despite inaccuracies and limitations and/or some evidence of a technical vocabulary or register will be offered.	Candidates demonstrate satisfactory evidence of application of critical reading techniques. A set of straightforward and relevant statements and an informed commentary will be offered.	3 (9–12 marks)

2 (3–4 marks)	Candidates communicate limited awareness and understanding of the categories, forms and uses of communication as applied to contemporary life. Limited in terms of its linguistic competence and/or its command of the language of the subject.	Candidates demonstrate limited evidence of application of critical reading techniques. Analysis will tend to be descriptive with little confidence or skill in handling ideas of representation. Some consideration of such elements as audience, context and effectiveness will be made.	2 (5–8 marks)
1 (1–2 marks)	Candidates communicate little awareness and understanding of the categories, forms and uses of communication as applied to contemporary life. Confused to the point where communication is impeded.	Candidates demonstrate little or no evidence of application of critical reading techniques. Little relevant material.	1 (1–4 marks)
