	(b)	Critically assess the role of the Crown Prosecution Service.	(25 marks)

- 2 (a) Explain and comment on the roles of the judge and the jury in a criminal trial. (15 marks)
 - (b) 'The police have insufficient powers to prevent and detect crime.'Discuss this view. (25 marks)

OR

3	(a)	Examine some of the problems of defining crime.	(15 marks)
	(b)	'In the 21st century there is no role for lay magistrates in the criminal justice system.'	
		Critically assess this view.	(25 marks)

SECTION B – POLITICS, POWER AND PARTICIPATION

Answer **one** question. Each question carries 40 marks.

EITHER

- 4 (a) Explain and comment on the steps that can be taken to increase the number of female MPs in the House of Commons. *(15 marks)*
 - (b) Discuss the extent to which the power of prime ministers has changed in recent years. (25 marks)

OR

- 5 (a) Examine the case for **and** against the use of referendums in the UK. (15 marks)
 - (b) Assess the extent to which, in the 21st century, the UK is part of the 'global village'. (25 marks)

OR

- 6 (a) Consider some of the powers available to Parliament to control the actions of the government. (15 marks)
 - (b) 'In a democracy the electoral system should ensure that the government has received the majority of the votes cast at a general election.'

Assess this view with reference to the UK. (25 marks)
