




A1 Read one of the following translations and answer the questions at the end.






- (a) Where is Odysseus while Athene is talking to Nausikaa? Describe what has happened to him after leaving Kalyps o's island. [10]

- (c) How does Athene describe an ideal Phaiakian girl in this passage? How far does Nausikaa live up to this standard? In your answer you should explain how Nausikaa is portrayed here and elsewhere in the Odyssey .

A2 Read one of the following translations and answer the questions at the end.



- (b) How does Homer make this passage vivid? In your answer you should include discussion of the imagery and choice of words. [15]
- (c) How are Eumaeus and Melanthius portrayed in this passage? How far is this typical of the way they are portrayed elsewhere in the Odyssey ? In your answer you should discuss both characters, giving examples of what they do and say.
