**1** Study the photograph and answer the questions.



(a) The photograph shows an artefact that was found in a room known as the 'Temple' at Mycenae.

What was found in this room and why have archaeologists named it the 'Temple'?

Your answer should include details of:

- the layout of the room;
- this and other artefacts.

(b) How useful can artefacts from Classical periods be in teaching us about the daily life of ordinary people?

In your answer you should include discussion of **both** the Mycenaeans **and** any other Classical society that you have studied. You should discuss **at least two** artefacts. [20]

(c) How successfully can we use graves and tombs to show us how ancient civilisations respected the dead?

In your answer you should include discussion of **both** the Mycenaeans **and one** other Classical society that you have studied. [25]

Do not answer this question if you have already answered Question 1.

Marks are awarded in parts (b) and (c) of Questions 1 and 2 for the quality of written communication in your answer.

2 Study the photograph and answer the questions.



(a) The photograph shows a Mycenaean dagger, with a mirror reflecting its lower surface.

What other small metal objects have been found from the Mycenaean period? Describe how the Mycenaeans made objects such as these.

- (b) It is likely that such a dagger would have been used by a wealthy person. How successfully, however, can we learn about the life of the poor in an ancient society?

In your answer you should include discussion of **both** Mycenaean archaeology and **at least one other** period of Classical study. [20]

(c) How successfully can we use archaeology to understand the ways in which an ancient society fought in war?

In your answer you should include discussion of **both** Mycenaean archaeology and the archaeology of **at least one other** period of Classical study. [25]

- 4 How successfully can archaeologists tell the date of manufacture of an object?

In your answer, you should:

- include discussion of scientific and more traditional methods of dating;
- discuss different dating techniques that have been used at Classical sites;
- refer to evidence from the Classical sites you have studied.
- 5 'You can't be a good archaeologist without being good at paperwork.'

In your answer, you should:

- consider different types of paperwork and site records;
- include an analysis of the usefulness of paperwork and recording for an archaeologist;
- refer to evidence from at least two of the Classical sites you have studied. [45]
