

(a) The gold hairpin above is an example of an item found in a grave at Mycenae. Describe some other artefacts that have been found in graves at Mycenae.

Your description should include:

- a range of different types of artefact;
- how these artefacts could have been used.
- (b) How useful can the object above be in teaching us about everyday life? Choose another object from a non-Mycenaean civilisation and explain which of the two objects is more useful in teaching us about everyday life. [20]
- (c) 'Everyday life in Classical societies was little more than a struggle to stay alive.' How far do you agree with this statement?


In your answer you should include discussion of **both** the Mycenaeans **and one** other Classical society that you have studied. [25]

- (a) This photograph shows part of the site of Tiryns. What have archaeologists found at Tiryns? [10]
- (b) Using the photograph as a starting point, discuss how skilful builders were in **both** the Mycenaean civilisation and **one** other Classical society. [20]
- (c) Compare the usefulness of Tiryns to archaeologists with any other site that you have studied. Explain which you think is the more useful site in teaching us about the people who lived there.

In your answer you should include discussion of Tiryns and **one** other site. Your other site may be a Mycenaean site or a site from another Classical period. [25]

3 Which is more useful in teaching us about the past, written evidence left behind by the people who lived then, or the archaeological evidence?

In your answer you should:

- consider the usefulness and limitations of written evidence;
- include an analysis of the usefulness and limitations of archaeological evidence;
- use specific evidence from your study of written evidence and Classical sites. [45]
- 4 'Archaeology now is much better than it was in the early years of classical Archaeology.' Explain how far you agree with this statement.

In your answer you should:

- consider the development of scientific methods and new technologies;
- include a discussion of different archaeological techniques;
- use specific evidence from the Classical sites you have studied.
- 5 'Conservation of evidence from the past is the most important job of an archaeologist.' How far do you agree with this statement?

In your answer you should:

- consider how archaeologists conserve evidence;
- include a discussion of what else an archaeologist does;
- support your answer with evidence from any of the sites you have studied. [45]
