- (b) What were the main features of the House of Menander, part of which is shown in Photograph B? In your opinion, how impressed would Roman visitors to this house have been? [20]
- (c) 'The same but different.' How far do you agree with this description of the houses in Pompeii and Herculaneum which you have studied? [25]

Do not answer this question if you have already answered Question 1.
