SECTION A

1 Translate the following passage into English.

Please write your translation on alternate lines.

Phillidas, leader of the exiled party of Thebes, and his men conspire to rid the city of the ruling party, called 'polemarchs', including their leader Leontiades.

According to one version of the story, this is how the polemarchs died.

λαβών δὲ ὁ Φιλλίδας τρεῖς τῶν ἀνδρῶν ἐπορεύετο ἐπὶ τὴν τοῦ Λεοντιάδου οἰκίαν· κόψας δὲ τὴν θύραν εἶπεν ὅτι παρὰ τῶν πολεμάρχων¹ ἀπαγγεῖλαί τι βούλοιτο. ὁ δὲ ἐτύγχανε μὲν μόνος κατακείμενος ἔτι μετὰ δεῖπνον, καὶ ἡ γυνὴ ἐργαζομένη παρεκάθητο. ἐκέλευσε δὲ τὸν Φιλλίδαν πιστὸν νομίζων εἰσιέναι. οἱ δ' ἐπεὶ εἰσῆλθον, τὸν μὲν ἀπέκτειναν, τὴν δὲ γυναῖκα κατεσιώπησαν². ἐξιόντες δὲ ἐκέλευσαν τὴν θύραν κεκλεῖσθαι³. εἰ δὲ εὑρήσονται ἀνεωγμένην⁴, ἠπείλησαν ἀποκτεῖναι πάντας τοὺς ἐν τῇ οἰκία.

ἐπεὶ δὲ ταῦτα ἐπέπǫακτο, λαβὼν δύο ὁ Φιλλίδας τῶν ἀνδǫῶν ἦλθε πǫὀς τὸ δεσμωτήǫιον, καὶ εἶπε τῷ φύλακι ὅτι ἀνδǫα ἀγοι παǫὰ πολεμάǫχων¹ ὃν εἶǫξαι⁵ δεῖ. ὡς δὲ ἀνέφξε⁴, τοῦτον μὲν εὐθὺς ἀπέκτειναν, τοὺς δὲ δεσμώτας ἔλυσαν. καὶ τούτους μὲν ταχὺ ὅπλα λαβόντες ὥπλισαν, καὶ ἀγαγόντες ἐπὶ τὸ Ἀμφεῖον παǫασκευάσασθαι ἐκέλευον εἰς μάχην.

ἐκ δὲ τούτου εὐθὺς ἐκήǫυττον ἐξιέναι πάντας Θηβαίους, ἱππέας τε καὶ ὁπλίτας, ὡς τῶν τυǫάννων τεθνεώτων. οἱ δὲ πολῖται, ἕως μὲν νὺξ ἦν, ἡσύχαζον· ἐπεὶ δ᾽ ἡμέǫα τ᾽ ἦν καὶ δῆλον ἦν τὸ γεγενημένον, ταχὺ δὴ καὶ οἱ ὁπλῖται καὶ οἱ ἱππεῖς σὺν τοῖς ὅπλοις ἐβοήθουν.

2 Translate the following passage into English.

Please write your translation on alternate lines.

The speaker outlines to a jury of Athenians the plot conceived by Theramenes to compel the Athenian assembly to elect thirty men to rule the city.

Theramenes arose, and ordered you to entrust the city to thirty men. But you protested against what he proposed, for you realised that you had to choose between slavery and freedom in the Assembly that day.

τῶν δ' ἐν τῆ ἐκκλησία ὅσοι ἄνδϱες ἀγαθοὶ ἦσαν, γνόντες τὴν παǫασκευὴν¹ καὶ τὴν ἀνάγκην, οἱ μὲν αὐτοῦ² μένοντες ἡσύχαζον, οἱ δὲ ἀπῆλθον, τοῦτο γοῦν εἰδότες, ὅτι οὐδὲν κακὸν τῆ πόλει ἐψηφίσαντο· ὀλίγοι δέ τινες καὶ πονηǫοὶ³ καὶ κακῶς βουλευόμενοι τὰ ποοσταχθέντα⁴ ἐχειǫοτόνησαν⁵.

παφήγγελτο⁶ γὰφ αὐτοῖς δέκα μὲν οὓς Θηφαμένης εἵλετο χειφοτονῆσαι⁵, δέκα δὲ οῦς οἱ καθεστηκότες ἔφοφοι⁷ κελεύοιεν, δέκα δ᾽ ἐκ τῶν παφόντων· οὕτω γὰφ τὴν ὑμετέφαν ἀσθένειαν ἑώφων καὶ τὴν αὑτῶν δύναμιν ἠπίσταντο, ὥστε πφότεφον ἦδεσαν τὰ μέλλοντα ἐν τῆ ἐκκλησία πφαχθήσεσθαι.
