GCSE Ancient History

- Understand the background to the world we live in today.




GCSE Short Courses

Shortened specifications offer a slimmed-down version of a full GCSE course. The following are available as GCSE short courses:

- Ancient History
- History B

The benefits of taking a short course:

- There is greater **flexibility** in the subjects covered and the time taken to complete the course.
- Students who are interested in history, but don't have time to study a full course, have **more** learning options.
- More able students can **complement** their studies by taking the course as an additional subject.



IGCSE History

IGCSEs and GCSEs are equivalent qualifications, but, Cambridge IGCSEs are linear and are designed to be taught holistically to allow more time for students to develop their ideas. Exams are at the end of the two-year course, providing more time for teaching and learning. Cambridge IGCSE provides students with excellent preparation for their next steps, including progression to further education such as A/AS Level study and employment.

- **Choose** from a wider variety of topics in order to develop an interest in, and enthusiasm for, learning and understanding from history.
- **Develop** skills in analysis, interpretation and evaluation throughout the course.
- Take a different approach to assessment to help you make the best choice for your students.

A Level Ancient History

Explore fascinating and highly relevant issues, from citizenship to the birth of democracy, by investigating classical sources in their ancient world context.

- Gain knowledge and understanding of selected aspects of classical civilisation.
- Understand the continuing influence of the classical world on current times.
- Develop sophisticated analytical and evaluative skills.

A Level History A

Examine a wide range of topics in British, European and world history, from the medieval period through to the late 20th century.

- Stretch and challenge existing understanding of key historical subjects.
- **Develop** expertise in general as well as historical skills.
- Demonstrate knowledge and understanding of the periods studied.

A Level History B

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Develop an understanding of the nature of history as a discipline, through the study of four crucial aspects of the subject: historical explanation, the role of sources in historical enquiry, the role of interpretations in history, and historical significance.

- **Look** at the 'why' and 'how' of history, as well as the more traditional 'what'.
- **Develop** a coherent knowledge of the past and the way it is presented.
- **Develop** an understanding of history as a discipline, with a conceptual approach that focuses on different aspects of the subject, and that will be especially familiar to teachers of GCSE History A Schools History Project.
