## **Argument A**

International festivals of sport such as the Olympics or the Football World Cup are fantastic celebrations of all that is best about the human spirit. Barriers of race, religion and social class are all broken down in the name of true sporting competition. Events such as these remind us that there really is only one race: the human race. We are able to celebrate cultural diversity without any sense that some cultures are 'better' or more advantaged than others.

## **Argument B**

International festivals of sport such as the Olympics or the Football World Cup are sickening reminders of the depth of division between the 'haves' and the 'have-nots'. These games are cynically exploited by nation states and multinational corporations in order to promote apathy and consumerism amongst the viewing millions. On each occasion, the host nation uses the event to communicate a thoroughly false and misleading impression of its culture to the rest of the world.
