- (ii) Explain the advantages and disadvantages of each of the following 3-D methods of presenting ideas for textile products.
 - fabric prototype/toile
 - virtual catwalk

- 2 You are asked to produce design ideas for an exciting range of fashion products or decorative furnishings that:
 - use the theme of food and/or drink
 - use a range of fabrics and colours

 - use an appropriate range of components
 - are suitable for small scale production.
 - (a) On sheet 1, produce a range of annotated initial design ideas. (15 marks)
 - (b) On sheet **2**, develop a final design solution for **one** product. Your final design should include the following:
 - a final presentation drawing
 - details of how the product will be constructed
 - details of fabrics and components
 - appropriate dimensions
 - how your design meets the specification.

(iii)	appropriateness of fabrics and components	(12 marks)
(iv)	sizing and dimensioning	(4 marks)
