- **3** With specific reference to Artaud's writings and/or theatrical projects, explain his ideas about how performers might use their physical and vocal skills to affect the audience.
- 4 Explain the ways in which **one** practitioner reacted against the theatre of his day. Your answer should include specific reference to your chosen practitioner's theoretical writings and/or his theatrical projects/productions.
