- (a) Explain how wages are determined in the labour market.

- (a) Explain why the Government provides public goods such as defence and merit goods such as health care. [10]
- (b) Discuss the view that health care should be paid for through taxes rather than through charges to patients. [10]

- (a) What factors determine the level of investment in an economy? [10]
- (b) Discuss the view that more investment spending and less consumer spending will always benefit an economy. [10]

4. THE MONETARY POLICY COMMITTEE RELIES ON INTEREST RATES TO CONTROL AGGREGATE DEMAND

- (a) Explain how an increase in interest rates is likely to affect the components of aggregate demand. [10]
- (b) Evaluate the view that a government need only rely on control of aggregate demand to reduce both inflation and unemployment. [10]

5. UK CLOCKS UP DISMAL RECORD ON PRODUCTIVITY AS TRADE DEFICIT CONTINUES

- (a) Explain, with examples, the measures that could be taken to raise productivity in the UK economy. [10]
