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## **GLASTONBURY**

### **EITHER**

- 1 A record company is producing a CD selection of music performed at the Glastonbury Festival from its beginnings up to the present time.

Use the material provided to write the text for the accompanying illustrated booklet that will be inserted in the CD case. This should describe some of the major developments which have given the festival its particular identity. You are not expected to mention in any detail the music that forms the compilation.

Write about 1000 words.

Briefly and clearly indicate your preferred layout, as well as any illustrations that you wish to be used.

Your text should be accompanied by a commentary in which you explain some of the significant decisions and choices you have made in writing it. The commentary should be approximately 150 – 200 words.

### **OR**

- 2 As the time for the 2004 Glastonbury Festival approaches, Radio 1 is planning to introduce coverage of the event in a programme which explores the festival's history and development.

You have been asked to write the script for this programme using the material provided.

Write about 1000 words.

Your text should be accompanied by a commentary in which you explain some of the significant decisions and choices you have made in writing it. The commentary should be approximately 150 – 200 words.

**SPELLING****OR**

- 3** An educational publishing company is launching a range of appealing and informative wall posters for display in school classrooms on important topics about the English Language. The posters are aimed at Key Stage Three students (Years 7, 8 and 9).

The series will include *English as a World Language*, *The History of English* and *A Guide to English Grammar*, for example.

You have been asked to write the texts for the two posters on Spelling using the material in the source file.

Write about 1000 words.

Briefly and clearly indicate your preferred layouts, as well as any illustrations that you wish to be used.

Your texts should be accompanied by a commentary in which you explain some of the significant decisions and choices you have made in writing it. The commentary should be approximately 150 – 200 words.

**OR**

- 4** A magazine aimed at parents entitled *You and Your Child* is running a series of articles on key topics in modern education.

The articles are intended to cover topics in a lively and interesting way and also to provide reassuring advice about how parents can help their children in these areas.

You have been asked to write the article on Spelling using the material in the source file.

Write about 1000 words.

Briefly and clearly indicate your preferred layout, as well as any illustrations that you wish to be used.

Your text should be accompanied by a commentary in which you explain some of the significant decisions and choices you have made in writing it. The commentary should be approximately 150 – 200 words.
