Question 1

Texts A and **B** are transcripts of Jake, 4 years old, reading bedtime stories with his parents.

Referring in detail to the transcripts and to relevant ideas from language study, analyse the parent and child interactions in this context. (48 marks)

OR

Question 2

Tom wrote **Texts C** and **D** in science lessons.

He wrote **Text C** when he was 5 years 9 months and **Text D** when he was 7 years 4 months.

Referring in detail to **Text C** and **Text D** and to relevant ideas from language study, explore early literacy development. (48 marks)

Section B - Language Change

Answer one question from this section.

Question 3

Text E is from the Oxford English Dictionary online. It is an article from their Quarterly Updates on new words. It was published in December 2006.

Referring in detail to the text and to relevant ideas from language study, explore attitudes to language change over time and the ways language changes and how these changes are recorded.

Question 4

Texts F and **G** are records of court cases tried at the Old Bailey, the Central Criminal Court in London. **Text F** is from 1719. **Text G** is from 1912.

Referring to both texts in detail and to relevant ideas from language study, analyse how language has changed over time. (48 marks)
