



NEW A Level English Language

H069 and H469 replacing 3827 and 7827:

Information for OCR centres transferring to the **new specification** for first teaching in 2008

This document maps the current A Level English Language specification to the new specification for first teaching in September 2008. It includes information on the changes, support available and an outline of the new specification. It is intended to help ease the transition for Heads of Department and teachers involved in the teaching of English Language.

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QCA have stipulated that:

- The number of units required to achieve GCE A Level is to be reduced from 6 to 4
- AS and A Level specifications should introduce concepts and methods of the discipline of linguistic study in relation to a range of spoken and written forms of English, including electronic and multimodal forms
- 'Frameworks' now referred to as 'Key Constituents of Language' and include 'phonetics', 'phonology', 'lexis', 'morphology', and 'grammar'
- Reference to 'semantics' and 'pragmatics' is no longer a specific requirement
- Assessment Objectives reduced from seven to four
- All specifications must have internal assessment
- Stretch and Challenge style questions to be introduced into A2 assessment
